SAVE LIVES OF

INTERNATIONAL CHAMPION'S MEN (Canadian Press Despatch)
Halifax, April 11—Calvin Ringer and Harry Firth, members of the crew of the American schooner Esperanto, which won the international schooner race last year, were rescued from drowning today at Liverpool (N. S.), by Michael Collins, second engineer of the dredge No. 1, and George Lyle, of the government tug Ligat. The Esperanto was anchored off Liverpool and the two fishermen in a dory with sail set started to go up the Mersey river.
When some distance from the shore a heavy squall struck and capsized the dory which filled with water. The men clung to the upturned craft and were almost helpless from the cold when Collins and Lyle put out in a boat and rescued them.

SAYS U. S. RAILWAY MEN HELD PISTOLS AT BOARD HEADS

(Canadian Press Despatch)
Victoria, B. C., April 11—Solution of Canada's railway problem can be found only in a business discussion between business men who run railways and business representatives of employees, Hon. F. B. Carroll told the Canadian Club today. He believed the solution would come in a year or two and expressed the hope that before long railway matters in the Dominion would be handled by Canadians.
Discussion of railway problems while traveling in his official capacity the chairman explained by saying the board's award of increased freight rates had evoked criticism. "Consequently," he said, "we are going to give the public the truth about the railway situation."
The McCaDo award, he said, was given to Canadian railway workers, not because it affected Canada, but because "these gentlemen from the States" had journeyed up to Canada and threatened that they would call a strike in this country if the award was not given to Canadian workers. It was difficult to imagine anything, he thought, more humiliating than that labor leaders in the United States should be able to hold a pistol to our heads.
Cost \$40,000,000.
The McCaDo award added more than \$40,000,000 a year to Canada's railway expenditures. The railway commission was forced to grant increased freight rates to prevent the Canadian National Railway from going to the wall. It had been suggested that the Canadian Pacific Railway should have paid the extra wages out of its reserve. It was proved, however, that if they did, there would have been no reserve in four years and the Canadian Pacific Railway would be in the same position as the Canadian National and the Grand Trunk Railway is today.

C.).

BONAR LAW FAVORS FIRE, NOT FIREWORKS

Contrary to a popular idea, nowhere does fluency of speech count for less than in England's House of Commons, according to Andrew Bonar Law, who for twenty years has been a member of parliament and until his recent resignation was the government leader in the House. Bonar Law was speaking of the qualities that make for success in public life.
"In parliament it is not the set speech but the debating speech which is effective," he said in the course of his inaugural address as Lord Rector of Glasgow University. "As in war the guns which may secure victory are not necessarily the biggest, but those which are placed in the best position, so in parliament the heavier the calibre of the guns the better, but at all costs they must be quick firing."
"There have always been, and there are now in parliament, men whose speaking when they began seemed hopelessly bad, but who, nevertheless, have taken their place in the front rank of statesmen."
