
**MONCTON ROTARIANS ACTIVE IN BOYS' WORK**

**THE COAL STRIKE MEANS INCREASE IN LONDON SUNSHINE**  
London, June 9—The old adage, "there is no great loss without some small gain" is again exemplified. London which has groped under its pall of smoke and fog so long that the mind of man runneth not to the contrary, is basking in sunshine since the supply of soft coal became exhausted. Since early April wonderful summer weather has prevailed. Almost since the opening of the coal dispute the metropolis has enjoyed clear pure air for the first time in the history of the present generation. "The stagnation of the coal supply is responsible for all the sunburnt faces we see in London," declares Sir William Bragg, professor of physics in London University. "The particles of dust and moisture which constitute smoke absorb the ultra-violet rays of the sun. In the absence of the smoke the people are getting the full benefit of the sun's rays."
