

From Turkish Frontier.

London, Oct. 5.—The wires from the mear eastern capitals last night were somewhat ominously reticent or altogether silent. A brief despatch announcing that railway traffic had been stopped between Constantinople and Mustapha Pasha and Dodechatach and confirmation of the news that Bulgarians had crossed the Turkish frontier was practically all the information of a military nature received in London yesterday and shows that the telegraphic censorship is active.

One hopeful sign, however, is the fact that dinformatic relations still remain unbroken and that apparently no ultimatum or a declaration of war has been made: Therefore diplomacy still has time to act in the interests of peace.

Many Starting Rumors.

London, Oct. 5.—The Daily Chronicle's Constantinople correspondent says there are rumors in Constantinople that 4,000 Greeks have invaded Turkish territory, that Bulgarian bands are said to be invading Macedonia and committing dynamite outrages, and that Servina bands in Novipazar are committing terrible atrocities. "It is believed here," continues the correspondent, "that Bulgaria will mark the amniversary of her independence on Saturday by declaring war. If Saturday passes without any irrevocable step being taken, hope will revive of a peaceful issue."
