

## FOURTH SESSION, 1870-71.

THE Faculty of Medicine of Dalhousie College and University beg to announce that their Fourth Session will be of Six Months' duration, and that, having filled the vacant Chairs of *Medicine, Surgery, and Medical Jurisprudence*, and made all necessary arrangements, they will be enabled to offer every facility to Students for obtaining a good *Medical Education*.

After an experience of three years, the Faculty feel justified in saying that a necessity exists for the establishment of a full Medical School, to give systematic instruction to the large number of Medical Students in Nova Scotia and the adjoining Provinces who have heretofore had few facilities for obtaining a thorough medical education, or of profitably occupying the three years nominally given to study.

Attention has thus far been devoted to the primary branches, with Clinical Medicine and Surgery, but the growing wants of the Province will not be satisfied with a short Session and restricted curriculum; hence, to satisfy this demand, the Faculty, with the advice and approval of the Board of Governors, have decided to inaugurate a full six months' term. It will be their aim to utilize all the advantages that exist in the city of Halifax—the Hospital, Dispensary, and Poors' Asylum, where a large number of patients are treated yearly, and every variety of disease illustrated. The best facilities will be furnished to Students for clinical observations under the direction of the Professors, Physical Diagnosis being specially attended to without extra fee. The Faculty are happy to announce that they have secured the valuable coöperation of H. Blanchard, Esq., Q.C., who will deliver a course of Lectures, in connection with Medical Jurisprudence, on the relations of the profession to Courts of Law. This is an innovation on the ordinary custom, but it is believed to be a necessary and progressive step. The qualifications for graduation are the same as those at Montreal and most British Schools.

The Faculty has entered into correspondence with the Home and Foreign Medical Schools and Examining Boards, to the end that the class tickets for the various Courses shall be accepted by them.
