His Royal Highness took special occasion to visit the three thousand school children. His appearance on the parapet opposite their location was the signal for an outburst of cheering and thousands of flags waved their greetings.

On Sunday afternoon the prince visited the Earl Grey Sanatorium, where he had chats with the wardens and patients occupying the same. He went there in civilian clothes and, being recognized by a great many people who were informed of the intention of his visit.

CANADIAN NATIONAL RAILWAYS AGAIN TO THE FORE

To Operate Daily Trains Between Vancouver, Winnipeg and Toronto, commencing October 5th.

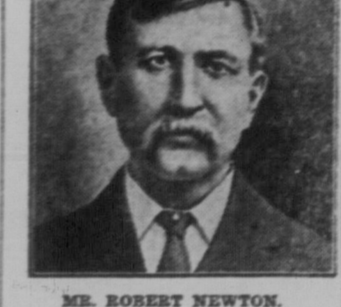

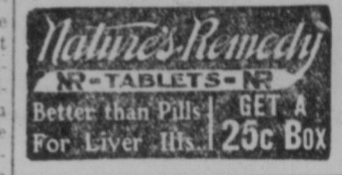
