LOYAL BOERS.
If the Boers will follow their old leaders as well in these times of peace as they did through the storm of war, there can be no doubt of the pacification of South Africa or of its future as a loyal state of the British Empire.
The cable brought word lately of General Delarey remarking at a congress of Boer farmers in the Transvaal that he "wished to bring to the notice of the world that the Boers had abandoned all thoughts of vindictiveness, and that it was their privilege now to work for peace." At the same meeting General Botha spoke. The latest mail quotes him as saying that "he was convinced that the same allegiance which had been given to the old would be given to the new government. They must show that they were loyal subjects."

The Boers so far have proved to be as "good losers" as they were fighters. Certainly, say the war, they have no reason to be otherwise. The British government has treated them with a clemency so great as to arouse the ire of South African colonists who remained loyal and who, when they lost thereby, have had to make their own losses good, while their Boer neighbors have been set up in business at their expense. But if this clemency serves the purpose for which it was intended, as it apparently is doing, the result will be worth many times the expenditure.

A MYSTERY.
It is strange that two successive ministers of railways should have sustained such an attitude toward the Grand Trunk Pacific as have Hon. Meers, Blair and Emmerson. Mr. Blair, the scheme point blank, made the strongest speech of his lifetime denouncing it and gave up his position in the government and retired from political life because of his convictions. Mr. Emmerson, who succeeded Mr. Blair as minister of railways, has sat silent throughout the long debate on the amended agreement. He has been repeatedly rallied by the opposition on his silence, but still declined to speak. This is a singular attitude, to say the least. What does it mean? There must be some cause for this extraordinary and ominous silence. Possibly it is an intended abandonment or indefinite postponement of the Quebec-Moncton section. We shall see. - Charlottetown Guardian.

MADE IN CANADA.
"When Canadians buy goods made in Canada the money they pay out is kept in circulation in this country, passing from one Canadian to another again and again in the course of trade, so that the whole community is benefited by it and the man who paid it out in the first place often gets it back again. When Canadians buy goods made in the United States, and other foreign countries, the money goes out of Canada, and Canadians in general receive no benefit from it."
There, succinctly stated, is the motive of the Canadian Industrial League, a branch of which was organized in St. John last night, the purpose of which will be to educate the people of St. John still further regarding the benefits of buying goods made in Canada. It is difficult to see what objection the patriotic members of any political party can present to the work of this organization.

It has been pointed out that if a man were born in the time of the apostles, had earned \$200 a year ever since, and had saved every cent, he would not have a million dollars yet.
