It is quite possible that the existing typographical strike will have considerable effect on the coming civic elections. Mayor Sears during his canvass has met union printers who have urged that the city printing be done in union shops and bear the union label. The labor unions of the city are sufficiently powerful to make this agreement worth consideration on the part of candidates for the mayoralty and for aldermanic honors.

As a tribe consists of from 300 to 500 families the expenses soon mount high. The Osages, being the richest reservation Indians there are today, can better afford to hold pony smokes, and combined with their forest day, they generally invite several hundred guests from the Ponca, Tonkawa and surrounding tribes. Those accepting the ponies are supposed to return equally expensive gifts later on.—Butte Express.
