

constitute an Executive Committee, any three of whom shall form a quorum. The departments of work taken up with their Superintendents shall be recommended by these general officers.

ARTICLE V.—DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

Section 1. PRESIDENT.—To call to order and open the meetings; to announce the business before the meeting in the order in which it is to be acted upon; to put to vote all questions which have been regularly moved and seconded and to announce the result; to preserve order and to decide, when referred to, all points of order or practice which may arise; to append her signature when necessary to all orders and proceedings of the Union; to have a general oversight of the Union, and in conjunction with the Executive Committee, to plan for its best interests and the good of the cause; to call special meetings when deemed advisable by herself and any three members of the Union, due notice being given to the members

Section 2. VICE-PRESIDENTS —To preside in their order, at meetings in the absence of the President, and to perform all duties of the President in case of absence on any account from her office; to interest the women of their respective churches in the work of the Union; to assist the President in arranging and carrying out plans for the benefit of the Union.

Section 3. CORRESPONDING SECRETARY.—To conduct the correspondence of the Union; to report annually to the County Superintendent of the district (having first submitted her report to the Union) giving such facts and items of general interest as will enable the County Superintendent to judge correctly of the condition of the Union and the progress of the work.

Section 4. RECORDING SECRETARY —To keep a record of the proceedings of the meetings of the Union; to notify the public of its meetings; to call the roll of members; to read all papers, etc., which may be required; to notify committees of their appointment, and of business referred to them; to take charge of all papers and documents of the Union; to make reports annually or quarterly as may be required

Section 5. TREASURER. — To collect the membership dues, and to devise ways and means to increase the funds of the Union; to forward to the Maritime Treasurer, on or
