NEW COMPANIES APPLY FOR INCORPORATION

Assets of Canadian Coal Corporation will be Sold—Provincial Constables Removed from Office for Cause.

Fredericton, March 26.—Application for incorporation as the Great Canada Northern Black Fox Company, Ltd., is being made by Messrs. Andrew Loggie, of Dalhousie; Robert Loggie, of Loggieville; Robert Murray, of Chatham; and Waldron Prowse, of Charlottetown. The company will have an authorized capitalization of \$250,000 and plan to carry on a black fox farm and ranching business with headquarters at Loggieville, Northumberland County. Messrs. John C. Bortie, Wm. A. Dougherty, Henry A. Powell, Wm. J. Ingram and W. Henry Harrison, of St. John, are applying for incorporation as the New Brunswick Transportation Company, Ltd., with an authorized capitalization of \$50,000. The company plan to carry on the business of transporting passengers and freight by means of horse drawn and motor driven vehicles, with head offices at St. John.

William Upton, of Minto, Queens County, a provincial constable, has resigned voluntarily. Rev. W. P. Best, of Harcourt, Kent County, has been authorized to solemnize marriages. An assignment for the benefit of his creditors has been made by Octave Robichaud, merchant, Beresford, Gloucester County. As a result of a chancery suit the assets of the Canadian Coal Corporation, a company promoted and for a time managed by Fred Pierpont Shaw, who was well known here and who met a tragic death in the same some months ago, have been ordered sold and a notice to that effect appears in the Royal Gazette this week, signed by John R. Dunn, Master of the Supreme Court, of Georgetown.
