SCHOONERS AND STEAMERS ASHORE—PACKET SCHR. LOST.

Steamer Sold by Auction—Thousands of Russians for Canada—Dynamite Schooner Ashore—Recent Charters

STEAMER SOLD BY AUCTION. United States Marshal Henry W. Mayo sold by auction at Bucksport on Tuesday afternoon the steamer Tremont, which has been tied up there for quite a while.

ASHORE AND FLOATED. Steamer Monksaven, Captain Milburn, from Las Palmas, which arrived at Gulfport, Tuesday, reports to be on a shoal off Dry Tortugas, June 13, floated off without assistance and without apparent damage.

LOADS AT HALIFAX. Steamer Louisiana will proceed from Boston to Halifax to load for United Kingdom.

SCHOONERS DRAGGED. During a high wind Wednesday at night the schooner M. J. Taylor dragged her anchor and fouled the schooner M. A. Achorn, damaging her considerably.

BOUND FOR CANADA. Steamship Patricia docked at Halifax Thursday morning from Hamburg. She brought out 2100 passengers, of whom 1170 were bound to the United States.

STEAMER ASHORE. Gulfport, June 18.—Str Monksaven (Br), Milburn, from Las Palmas, which arrived here today, reports stranded on a shoal off Dry Tortugas, June 13, floated off without assistance and without apparent damage.

HAD DYNAMITE CARGO. Seattle, June 13.—Sch Dupont (owned by Dupont Powder Co), struck a pile in east waterway this morning and sank; she was later floated with a hole in hull; the schooner had a cargo of dynamite aboard.

FLOATED BY CUTTER. Vineyard Haven, Mass., June 18.—Sch Regina, Sanborn, Machias for Wareham, with lumber, ran ashore on Great Point Rip, Nantucket Shoals, yesterday morning during hazy weather. Revenue cutter Acushnet floated her at 8 a. m., leaking so badly that her pumps could not free her and the Acushnet towed her to destination.

THE EMPRESS STEAMERS. The S. S. Empress of Japan arrived at Yokohama on June 18th, between 8 and 10 a. m. The S. S. Empress of Britain, from Montreal, June 11th, arrived at Liverpool on Thursday at 9 p. m.

THOUSAND BUSHELS OF SALT. Portland, Me., June 20.—Something like 100,000 bushels of salt is booked to arrive here during the month of July. In addition to the Italian bark Santa Maria, now on the way from Trapani, which she left on May 4 with about 1300 tons of salt for the W. H. Shurtleeff Co, the Lord Brothers have just chartered two vessels, the barkentine Mabel I Meyers and the schooner Elizabeth Gilbert, to load salt at Turks Island. Both are expected to reach here the latter part of July, the Meyers with about 20,000 bushels, the schooner having about 22,000.

PACKET SCHOONER WRECKED. Portland, Me., July 19.—Word was received here yesterday of the almost certain loss of the schooner M. J. Sewall of Machias, one of the best known packet schooners sailing out of this port. The schooner, which is owned and commanded by Capt. George Beal, left here on Sunday last for Jonesport and other ports at the eastward laden with a general cargo of flour, oil, groceries, etc. The schooner put into Boothbay Harbor the same night and remained there until Tuesday morning, when she resumed her voyage. Shortly after when off Mosquito Island, and to the eastward of Port Clyde, the steering gear gave way and before the anchor could be dropped the schooner drifted on the rocks, the ledges being so near shore that the two men on board got ashore without much difficulty. The tug Cumberland came to the schooner's aid from Rockland, but made no attempt to pull her off the ledges, she being full of water, with a hole stove in her side. In all probability the schooner will be a total loss, but some of her cargo is being saved in a damaged condition.

Gelatine Pineapple. Soak one box of gelatine in one cup of cold water. Shred one pineapple with a fork and add three-quarters of a cup of sugar to each cup. Let it stand for two hours. Turn off a cup of juice. Heat, but do not boil. Turn in the gelatine. Stir until all is dissolved. Now put in one cup of pineapple slices and turn into wet mold. Serve with cream of pineapple juice.
