Dying of Hydrophobia Several Months  
After Being Bitten by a Dog.

The distressing case of hydrophobia  
which resulted fatally in Washington,  
recently completely baffled the skill of the  
physicians. Mr. Richard Staples, the vic-  
tim of the strange ailment, was bitten by  
a small dog in Chicago several months  
ago. Although no wound appeared vis-  
ible, Mr. Staples began to show symptoms  
of hydrophobia some weeks ago, and later  
he experienced the most violent paroxysms.  
On Wednesday he became so violent  
that it became necessary to blind him,  
and his hands and feet were  
obtained for the purpose. The physicians  
tried to relieve him and he became more  
and more violent until it was found neces-  
sary to procure the assistance of six  
strong men to keep him from doing harm  
to himself and to others. During his  
paroxysms he foamed at the mouth and  
was the only thing that appeared to have  
a soothing effect on him and this threw  
him into a state of ecstasy. Last night  
he died. The physicians were unable to  
relieve him and he became more and  
more violent until it was found neces-  
sary to procure the assistance of six  
strong men to keep him from doing harm  
to himself and to others. During his  
paroxysms he foamed at the mouth and  
was the only thing that appeared to have  
a soothing effect on him and this threw  
him into a state of ecstasy. Last night  
he died.

Shipping Notes.

Barb Galleon—Louis West, seaman of  
the bark Galleon of Windsor, N. S., from  
New York for Corcum (before reported  
wrecked) makes the following report:  
Left New York Feb 8, 8.30 a. m., with  
W. N. W., moderate, weather fine. Be-  
tween 2 and 4 a. m. of the 19th a squall  
struck the ship and drew an eye-bolt out  
of the deck, port side. About 4.30 a. m.,  
all hands on deck, ship hoove to under  
bare poles, the masts and rigging blowing  
away. Another squall struck her on port  
side and threw her over on starboard  
side, and all hands got on to the beam  
ends, and in about an hour she  
broadside. In about an hour she  
righted, her main and mizzen masts  
carried away, also foretopmast.  
About 8 a. m. all hands except the cap-  
tain were washed off the wreck, and  
remained there about two days, when  
the master went on to the  
foretopmast with an A. B.
