penishment by Law inflicted on any person or persons convicted of the crime of Sacrilege or Burglary or Robbery from any person on or near the high-way, nor for Robbery from any person in a dwelling-house, out-house, store or other building in the day or night time, without breaking the same, and the person so robbed being put in feat; but that every person who may commit Sacrilege or Burglary or Robbery as aforesaid, and the accessaries before the sact, and being thereof lawfully convicted, shall suffer Death without Benefit of Glergy.

- VIII. And be it further enacted, that if any perfon or perfons shall with any offensive weapon or instruction well-awfully and maliciously assault, or shall by menaces or in or by any forcible or violent manner demand any money, goods, or chastels of or from any other perfon or persons, with a relations intent to rob or commit robbery upont any such person or persons, that then and in every such case all and every such person and persons to offending, being thereof lawfully convicted, shall be adjudged guilty of Felony, and shall suffer as by this Act is directed in cases of Grand Larceny.
- IX. Provided always and be it further enacted, that no person or persons, who hereafter may be convicted of having feloniously takens any money, goods or chattels from the person of any other, privily without his or her knowledge, shall be debarred the Benefit of Clergy for the first offence or felony commuted, where the value of the money, goods or chattels so privily taken, may not exceed tempounds sterling money aforesaid; any Law to the contrary notwithstanding.
- X. Previded always and be it declared and enacted, that nothing inthis Act contained shall alter or lessen or be construed to alter or lessen the crime of scoreting, embezzling or destroying any letter or packet, containing any bond, note, bill, receipt of other valuable paper, or of stealing out of any letter any bond, draught, bill or promisory note what-soever, for the payment of money, or of robbing any mail of any letter or letters, sent or conveyed by post, or shall in any degree alter or lessen the offence aforesaid or the punishment therefor directed
