

# Gullible Parents Escape Terrible Horrrifying Fate

The hellish nightmare is over now for George and Edna Forbes of Palooma, Colorado. They are no w free from the grasp of a quasi-religious cult, the Moral Majority.

"The past eight months have been rough for me and George," says Edna Forbes.

"We weren't sure we could make it. I can't believe I could be so gullible."

Late last August, the ENQUIRER has learned, the Forbes were selling books and trinkets for the Moral Majority, a quasi-religious cult led by Jerry Falwell, in the streets of Atlantic City, N.J. when they were rescued by their son, Dennis.

"We are grateful to our son, Denny (Dennis's nickname), for saving us from those wretched mind-bending beasts," says Edna's husband George, a chartered account-

tant in Palooma.

"We would still be their mindless pawns if it weren't for him."

Their friends agree that the last eight months have been tough for George and Edna.

"George and Edna have experienced deep emotional traumas — no doubt about it," says a close family friend.

"They program you to think that if you give up their way of life or if you stop believing the garbage that the Moral Majority stands for, you will be betraying God and you will be struck by lightning or you will burn in hell or something like that," says Edna.

The Forbes son, Dennis, a graduate of the University of Alberta who now lives in Bula Bula, Illinois, had a difficult time finding the whereabouts of his parents.

"I hired two private eyes to track them down, but that devious Moral Majority kept them moving from one location to another," says Dennis.

"We virtually had to kidnap them to get them to come with us, they were so indoctrinated," says Mickey Anastasio, one of the two private eyes hired by Dennis Forbes.

"When they saw me and Dennis get out of the cab, they took off down the street with their Faith Partner bibles and 4000 dollars cash. They weren't very fast, I guess the money and books were too heavy for them, so Dennis and I caught up to them right away," says Anastasio.

"When we caught up to them, they said they were on a mission from God and started to kick us in the shins and beat us with the Faith Partner bibles, but finally Mickey got them both in a headlock and held them until I could rent a car nearby," says Dennis.

When they were still zealots, George and Edna did a great deal of work for the Moral Majority, sending the money to the Thomas Rhoades Baptist Church in Lynchburg, Virginia, The Old Time Gospel Hour Show and Liberty Baptist College.

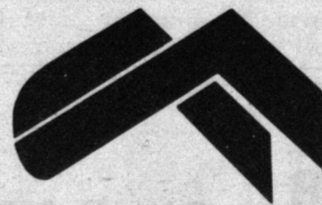

The work they did was not unlike the work done in other cult organizations, like the Moonies.

"We worked in New York and New Jersey," says George.

"We sold over five thousand copies of Faith Partner bibles at \$25.95 each to acrophobics who were going to the top of the World Trade Center or the Empire State Building."

"Our best sellers were pins that said things like 'In God We Trust', 'Save freedom — stop abortions and the E.R.A.', and 'Love your brother — but nuke those Commies', says George."
