in a very nice way and is usually preserved and through this medium you have an opportunity now to clinch by written word a great many of the fine points that you made when out here in regard to a closer getting-together, etc., and setting forth the aims and platform of Liberalism. I know this costs some money as the charge is \$500 per page but if the fational Committee have the money there I believe you could not spend \$1,000 better than to take a two page advertisement and fully set out your views. I understand that this is to be published on December 8th and, therefore, quick action is necessary.

I am writing to Mr. Haden also in the matter as I believe you referred it to the National Committee last year.

I wish to state again in closing how delighted I feel over your visit West and the excellent impression that you made. I should be glad to hear from you from time to time and to do my little bit in any way I may be called upon to advance the cause for which we mutually stand. Believe me,
