"Government's campaign seems to consist mostly of malicious misrepresentations. Have never proposed or expressed favour of amalgamation Canadian railways. On the contrary have definitely and repeatedly declared whole effort of Government) if elected, would be to avoid such result, and that favourable election verdict would never be used as mandate to amalgamate. This insidious campaign is inspired by members of the Government themselves, in hope to gain political advantage."

Which the "Herald" made of the meetings. The report without exception is the best I have ever seen of any meetings on either side of politics, and I cannot express in language too strong my feeling of obligation to you. How your staff managed to get this done so well in the few brief hours at your disposal is more than I can understand.
