SEPTEMBER.—Some years ago we gave a piece of advice which it l been suggested should be repeated. Canada thistles should be mo down when they are in full bloom or a little past; one cutting will ge erally suffice. Large quantities have frequently been destroyed by mowing, and it has been equally successful on white alders when cut the same forward state. White daisies or johnsworts are hard to ex minate. Where a good supply of plaster or gypsum is scattered over land white or red clover may take the place of johnswort. But there nothing better than sheep for destroying weeds. By repeatedly pasture with sheep the daisy will disappear, so will johnswort and other troublesome weeds. You may destroy your weeds and feed your she
