On motion of Mr. P. L. Panet, seconded by Mr. R. Panet,

Refolved, that the faid amendments be taken into confideration on

Monday next.

Mr. Lees reported that the messengers had waited upon His Excellency the Governor with the address of this House of Monday last, who had been graciously pleased to receive the same, and to comply therewith, by granting a Letter of Credit for one hundred pounds in savor of the Clerk of this House.

On motion of Mr. Richardson, seconded by Mr. Lester,

Ordered, that the ingrossed Bill for the appointment of In pectors to afcertain the quality of Pot and Pearl ashes for exportation, be now read the third time.

And the same was accordingly read for the third time.

On motion of Mr. J. A. Fanet, seconded by Mr. Bertbelot,

Ordered, that the word "Vender" in the 33d line of the first press of the Bill, be struck out, and the word "Proprietor" be substituted in its place.

And the faid amendment was made at the table.

Then on motion of Mr. Richardson, seconded by Mr. Lester,

Refolved, that the Bill do pass, and that the title be "An Act for the appointment of Inspectors to ascertain the quality of Pot and Pearl

" ashes for exportation."

Ordered, that this Bill be carried to the Legislative Council by Mr. Richardson and Mr. P. L. Panet, and that they do inform the faid Council, that the Assembly have passed the same and defire their concurrence.

Then on motion of Mr. M. Nider, seconded by Mr. J. A. Panet, The House adjourned till Monday next at three o'clock in the asternoon.
