And on motion of Mr. Hardy-Ordered, That he have leave Leave to bring to bring in a bill agreeable to the prayer of the faid petiti--on.

A petition of fundry inhabitants of the parish of Water- Petition preborough in Queen's county, was prefented to the Houfe and fented and read. read, fetting forth: That there are feveral Islands in that county fituated to near the main land that the owners thereof experience great inconvenience from the cattle of the proprietors of the main land fwimming across to fuch Illands; and that in confequence of the freshes the keeping up fences on those Islands is attended with confiderable expence; that they also find it very expensive and difadvantageous to fence respectively in front of their farms on the main land; and praying, that an act may be passed to declare that the waters furrounding those Islands may be deemed a lawful fence, and also that fences extending a certain length into the river on their lines may be judged legal against trespasses of cattle.

Thereupon Ordered, That a copy of the faid petition be lodged Order thereupon with the Clerk of the faid parish of Waterborough and also with the Clerk of the Peace in Queen's county, and that the fame be publicly read at the next Court of General Seffions of the Peace for the faid county, to the intent that all perfons interested may shew cause at the next session of the General Affembly why the prayer of the faid petition should not be grant-: cđ.
