Mr. Swabey, by leave, presented to the House a Petition of Hugh Logan, late Jailor in King's County, praying this House to concur in a grant to remunerate him for past services.

Ordered, That the said Petition be referred to the Select Committee appointed to report on all Petitions relating to Miscellaneous subjects.

Mr. President informed the House that Mr. Macintyre had tendered the resignation of his seat, as a Member of this House, to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, which resignation had been accepted by His Excellency.
