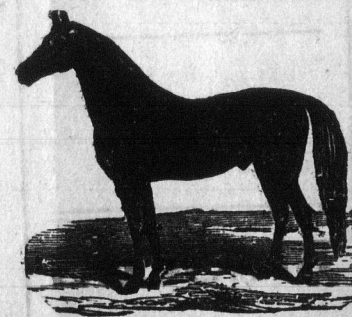

London, July 18.—The Leader's correspondent at Lisbon says that according to intelligence received there the insurrection in Matto Grosso, Brazil, is swelling to huge proportions. The insurgents, it is reported, have organized a large army and are marching on Rio Janeiro and already have captured several cities. Gen. Ribeiro with 40,000 federal troops, has been sent against the revolutionaries. Fearful carnage is reported, and the killed are said to be already more than 4,000.
