St. Petersburg, May 5.—The official announcement of Count Witte's retirement from the Premiership, the retirement from the Premiership, appeared this morning in the Official Messenger. Stishiusky, the assistant of the late Interior Minister Von Plebve, who is held to be responsible for the oppression of the provincial authorities, and Prince Shirinsky Shakmastoff, the assistant of the Holy Synod, Pobedonosiseff.

Even the Novoe Vremya says it is useless to attempt to claim that M. Goremykin is more liberal than Witte. The paper expresses the belief that Witte is only temporarily eclipsed and says the country cannot afford to dispense with the services of a man of his ability.
