# Starved and Frostbitten Sailors Saved From the Pitiless Sea.

Fishermen Picked Up Off Banks After | brandy. As the potent liquor sent the Being Fourteen Days Adrift in Open Dory-Lived for Two Weeks on a Small Piece of Cake and Lumps of

Fourteen days in a small dory and ine of these spent hemmed in by ice vas the terrible experience of George Barnes and Archibald Bungay, of who were picked up by the fishing schooner Florence M., thirty miles orth-west of St. Pierre and brought nto North Sydney, Sunday forenoon.

Bungay and Barnes were on the Newfoundland schooner T. A. Mahone, ishing on Quero Banks. They strayd from their vessel in a thick fog, ind were unable to find their way o her when it lifted.

The only food the men had on board he dory was a piece of eake. Besides this, however, there was a ten-pound butter tub filled with ice, which they nibbled to quench their raging thirst. Forced to Bail.

The men would undoubtedly have succumbed to the cold were it not for the fact that their dory was damaged by collision with the ice, and leaked so much as to require constant bailng. This enforced exercise kept them from freezing.

When the dory was sighted, Capt. Spencer of the Florence M. says the nen were almost completely exhaust-Barnes was in rather better shape than Bungay, who lay in the bottom of the boat unable to move. ary inquiry in the matter of the King stand up when he saw the schooner, but fell back each time.
