Vessel Ashore.

A TOTAL WRECK.
Capt. Joe Kean, of the S. S. Portia, wired the following message to Bowring Bros. last evening:—
"Bonnie Bay.—Returned unable to reach Curling. Gale raging with snow blizzards. Sighted schooner, apparently an American, drove on shore about two miles east of Trout River. Believe crew are safe, as no sign or signal seen by us."

With reference to the above Deputy Minister of Customs Lemesurier was in receipt of the accompanying message from Bonnie Bay:—

"The vessel reported ashore this morning proved to be the Miranda, of Gloucester, owned by the Gorton-Pew Fishing Co., which was collecting fish at Trout River, and broke from her moorings during a W. gale, becoming a total wreck, about two miles east of that place. Her cargo consisted of 250 quintals of fish. The crew left the vessel before the chains parted, landing safely at Trout River. Mountainous seas prevent salvage operations."
