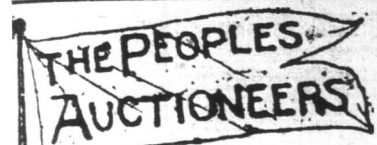

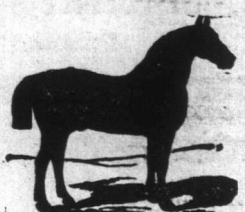

His Excellency the Governor has received the cablegram as under from the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, respecting the observance of Armistice Day.

CODE TELEGRAM FROM SECRETARY OF STATE TO HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR. (Received Nov. 2, 1920).

"Following for information of your Ministers—begins—it has been decided that on Thursday, Nov. 11th, 'being the second anniversary of armistice, Cenotaph in Whitehall shall be unveiled by H. M. the King and that as part of the ceremony on that day there shall be buried in Westminster Abbey an unknown British warrior whose body shall be taken from amongst those buried in France. Every precaution will be taken to prevent his identity being known. Coffin will be brought to Cenotaph where it will be met by the King attended by representatives of the whole Empire. There will be short service at Cenotaph consisting of singing of hymn 'O God our Help in Ages Past' and the 'Lord's Prayer. This service will be so timed that unveiling of Cenotaph shall place at 11 a.m., exactly after which there will be two minutes' silence followed by Last Post. Wreaths will then be laid by His Majesty, the Prime Minister and representatives of the Empire. Funeral procession will then proceed to Abbey where funeral service will take place body being buried in a grave in the nave of the Abbey.

"It is proposed that just as last year there should be two minutes' silence, complete suspension of all normal business work and locomotion throughout United Kingdom, that thoughts of all may be concentrated in reverent remembrance of 'the glorious dead'—ends.

MILNER.

His Excellency and Ministers feeling sure that the people of this ancient and loyal Colony desire to perpetuate the memory of our great deliverance and of those who laid down their lives to achieve it, direct that on Thursday next, 11th November, at 11 a.m., all normal activities shall be suspended for the space of 2 minutes, during which time all thoughts will be concentrated in reverent remembrance of the Glorious Dead.

It is decided that such observance shall take place throughout this Dominion. In St. John's the gun at Cabot Tower will be fired at the hour above named as a signal.

For the 2 minutes as above, trains will be stopped on the railways, traffic on the streets, ships at sea (as far as possible) and work suspended everywhere in schools, shops, mines, factories, etc. During the 2 minutes there should be complete silence.

His Excellency the Governor and Ministers believe that all will gladly interrupt their business and pleasure whatever it may be and unite in this simple service of silence and remembrance.
