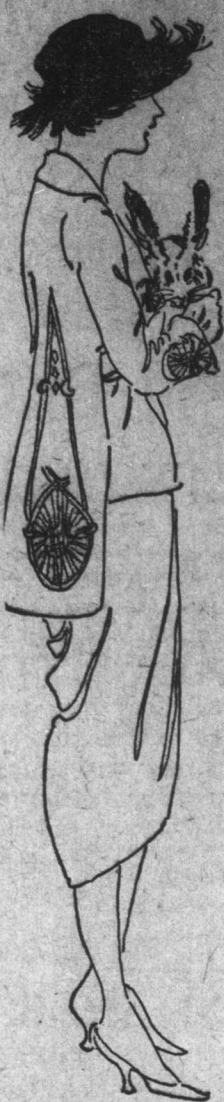
Some time ago we had the pleasure
of reviewing the first part of "Letters
from the Front," the work which the
Bank of Commerce has had
compiled in memory of those members
of its staff who served, and in many
cases died in the Great War. The
volume now lies before us, and
it is not only a magnificent tribute to
the men who gave their lives for their
country, but it is also a most interest-
ing and valuable book. It contains
brief sketches of the
lives of all the men who served in
the war, with accounts of those who
died in the field of honour. The volume
is illustrated with reproductions of
the various regiments, and
military plaques which have been
presented to the bank. The book
cannot do better than end this
series of the following extract
from the introduction to the volume
written by Mr. H. V. F. Jones, the
Assistant General Manager. "In dedicat-
ing this volume to all those of our
staff who assumed military duty, and
particularly to the memory of those
who gave their lives in defence of
their country, we hope that the example
of their self-sacrifice will prove a source
of inspiration to future generations of
the bank."

Economy Urged.

For Evening Telegram.
Dear Sir—Would you kindly allow
space in your esteemed paper to
make a few remarks on matters af-
fecting the welfare of our country.
Regarding Mr. Morgan's plans for
building the railroad I notice that
you people are expecting reduced
light and passenger fares, he plans
to raise them. He also plans to have
no rolling stock. In 1900 we had
half the rolling stock we have to-
day and the road paid expenses. Now
it is the use of a man having a
number of horses in his barn if he has
work for them? It is the same with
the railroad. I have travelled from
St. John's to Port aux Basques and I
saw lots of box and flat cars lying
on the sidings, this too when peo-
ple were asking for cars to get out
of the woods and timber. What is wanted
is more men to see that the sidings
are not piled with idle cars and also
that no freight train leaves a sta-
tion without taking all the freight. A
good man is needed and no more roll-
ing stock to rust out.
In regard to the present taxation I
notice the Government has to give out
enormous lot of relief work, but I
am afraid they will have to continue
it so if they do not reduce the
present duties. There are a great
number of our young men who dur-
ing the prosperous times saved consid-
erable money by working in Canada and
the United States. During the past
few months the savings of these
men have been eaten up by the high
cost of living, and they too will soon be
asking for relief from the Govern-
ment. Had the powers that be reduced
the taxes last year relief for so many
would not have been found them-
selves in debt at the end of the voy-
age. Why not cut down all the high
duties officials? They tell us they can-
not live on two or three thousand dol-
lars per year, even though they have
all families or none at all. Yet
harmless and others with a family of
seven or eight to clothe and feed are
expected to do it on one hundred and
thirty or twenty dollars. Cut down the
salaries, reduce expenditure and
over the taxes until a means is found
to save us from ruin.
