Mr. Thomey had been ill all the summer, and confined to his home for some time. He had been doing duty for H.M. Customs, at the Straits of Belle Isle last year, but through ill-health, was unable to return there this spring. Mr. Thomey had reached the age of fifty years, and leaves to mourn their sad loss a wife and six children, four sons, Nicholas, working at Corner Brook, Kennedy, at Strapp's Pharmacy, Roger and William and two daughters Nellie and Bridget at home. One sister, Mrs. (Capt.) Ellis, residing in England, and one brother, Mr. Samuel Thomey. Our deepest sympathy goes out to the family in their sad bereavement. The funeral was held today (Monday) afternoon and was very well attended. Service was held at the R. C. Cathedral and interment made in the R. C. Cemetery.
