It is expected that some hundreds will arrive from the nearby outports within the next day or two. The dancing gallery was well patronized last night and the music by the Prince's Orchestra helped to make the time pass enjoyably for all who attended. The Methodist Guards Band supplied the music in the Prince's Rink, and it was greatly appreciated by those present.
