



Another item which illustrates the changes that have taken place in a hundred years, records the public whipping of a colored thief who had stolen some lead from a building in Fleet Street. He was whipped at the cart's tail in the presence of theusands of spectators for a considerable distance through London streets. Even then the humanitarian movement was making headway. Previous to the victim's being tied to the cart a white man appeared stripped his back, and offered to undergo punishment in place of the black. When refused he poured such a volume of abuse on the City Marshal that he was locked up.
