The drill hall was gorgeous with flags and bunting, and adorned with many mottoes. The platform, which held nearly 200 of the representatives of citizens of Hamilton, was carpeted with rugs and draped with colored fabrics. In the boxes which overlooked the stage were seated many of the leading citizens of the city.

Mr. F. Gardiner occupied the chair in the absence through illness of Mr. T. H. MacPherson. Besides the premier's masterly address, stirring speeches were made by A. T. Wood, the senior Liberal candidate; Mr. W. J. Copp, the well known roundly man; Mr. J. W. Beisel, Q.C., junior Liberal candidate; Hon. Wm. Mulock, and John I. Platt, ex-M.P.P. The premier, in the course of his remarks, said: "We have now reached the last stage of a campaign which has been short and sharp, and, I believe, will be decisive—decisive in this respect, that on the 7th of November victory will rest with the Liberal party."
