NO CLASH OF IMMIGRATION AGENTS

Ottawa, Nov. 7.—Hon. Nelson Monteth, Ontario minister of agriculture, and Mr. C. C. James, his deputy, and Thomas Southworth, superintendent of colonization for Ontario, waited upon the Minister of the Interior today to discuss matters connected with the distribution of immigrants arriving in Ontario.

Both the provincial and the federal authorities maintain agents throughout the Province to take care of the distribution of the newcomers among the farmers who may want them. It has been claimed by the provincial authorities that this resulted in overlapping and clashing between the officials. The Minister of the Interior's information, however, went to show that whatever clashes had occurred between individual officials did not amount to much, and Mr. Oliver seemingly succeeded in convincing Mr. Monteth that things had better be left as they are for the present, until at least there were more coming in than the present organizations can find employment for.

Hon. Mr. Oliver quite recognized the work that the agents of the Provincial Government are doing, and added that if they were withdrawn the Dominion would only have to adopt federal officials in their place. But he would just as leave not have to do so.

As matters stand 200 agents of the Dominion department of immigration are scattered throughout Ontario ascertaining the names of the farmers who are in need of labor, and this information is used by the booking agents canvassing for immigrants in the United Kingdom.

Through his being able to tell a man where he can have employment in Canada, the agents are able to appeal with much greater force to prospective immigrants from the motherland than they could otherwise have done.

The committee appointed to visit the county of Wentworth last July, and was courteously received by Warden Vansickle, and Road Superintendent James L. Taylor. The committee were taken over a great part of the good roads system of that county, and were more favorably impressed with the benefits to the county in adopting this system of improving highways.

The committee met at the county buildings this morning, and adjourned to meet this afternoon, when Deputy Minister of Public Works A. W. Campbell, who arrived in the city this morning, will meet the committee and give them such assistance and advice as may be necessary in drafting the bylaw and otherwise.

The county of Middlesex feels that it should not be behind in this matter, and that it should take such action as may be necessary to share in the provision which the Government has made for encouraging these improvements.

THE W. C. T. U. ELECTS

Two London Ladies Given High Positions on the Executive.

Cornwall, Nov. 1.—The Provincial W. C. T. U. here today made the following election of officers:
President—Mrs. McKee, Barrie.
Vice-president—Mrs. May R. Thornley, London.

Corresponding secretary—Miss Flora Miller, London.
Recording secretary—Mrs. Irwin, Weston.
Treasurer—Mrs. B. O. Britton, Gananoque.

Y Secretary—Miss Lottie Harris, Toronto.

The report of the Y secretary showed 300 members in 15 unions, which have raised \$1,500 during the year.

Among the recommendations are:
1—The division of the province into two districts for the carrying on of the work.

2—The appeal to the magistrates of the province for the suppression of the sale of immoral postcards.

3—An appeal to the local members of the Legislature and to the minister of education for the re-introduction of the study of scientific temperance in the schools of the province.

4—An appeal to the provincial license boards for the suppression of the sale of brandy chocolates.

5—The agitation for a federal government enactment for the prohibition of the manufacture and sale of cigarettes, the enforcement to be left with the province.

6—Against the Government control of licenses.

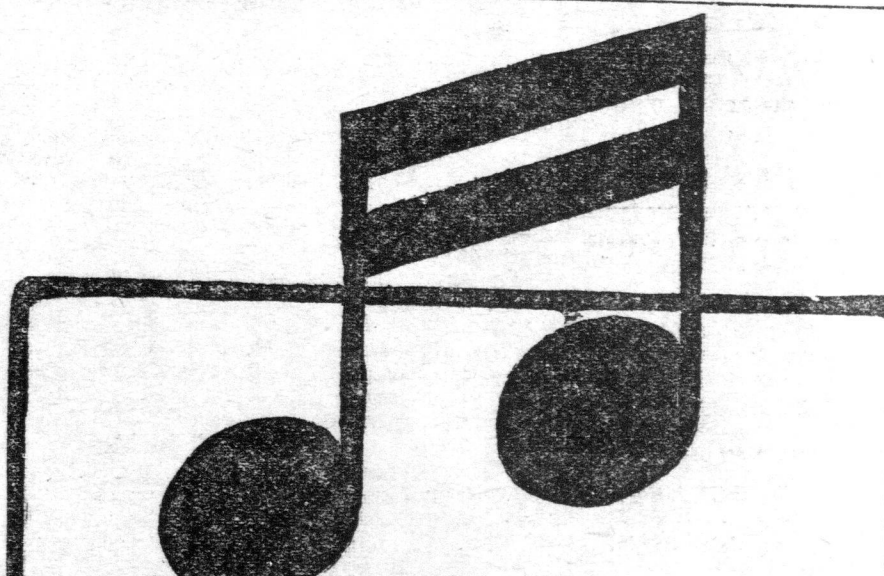
