NEARLY ALL MILLERS HAVE ENOUGH WHEAT

Sufficient to Last Until the New Crop Comes In.

Stratford, June 25 .- All except two out of twenty-two millers of Western Ontario, who met last week in Stratford reported that they had on hand sufficient wheat to supply their requirements until the new crop was available. Several millers had more than enough; one had 2,000 bushels to spare; another had about double what he would need.

Regarding the stocks of old wheat held by the farmers, these millers, covering the district bounded by Norwich and Glencoe on the west. Kincardine on the north, and Berlin on the east, estimated that in all this district farmers did not hold more than 10,000 bushels, and it was the general opinion that this small quantity scattered over such a large district would be all required for local use, as indications did not point to an early harvest.
