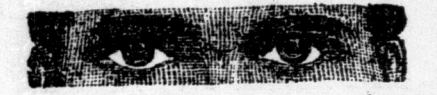

FORMER CHATHAM WOMAN

Denison, known as "Lady Gay," social editor of the Toronto Saturday Night, died in Victoria Memorial Hospital Saturday morning, at the age of 61. Mrs. Denison was one of the most widely known women journalists in Canada, having been connected with the Saturday Night for upwards of 20 years.

The late Mrs. Denison was a daughter of the late Archdeacon Sandys, of Chatham, Ont., and widow of the late Alfred Denison, who predeceased her by 18 months.

MANY PROTESTS AGAINST OFFICIAL "RED TAPE"

Friends of Would-Be Londoners, Incensed at His Being Debarred From Entry to Canada.

Friends in this city of Lul Costi, of Philadelphia, who was turned back at Niagara Falls three days ago because he had lived only four months in the United States, are greatly incensed at the narrow adherence of the immigration officials to red tape rules and regulations. Mr. Costi has a cousin in London to whom he was coming, but on account of his limited knowledge of English, was stopped at the border by the Canadian immigration officials.

One of his friends here interested Mayor Graham in his behalf, and the latter telegraphed to Chief Immigration Officer Scott at Ottawa. Superintendent Scott replied, however, that Costi could not be admitted to Canada for several reasons, one of which was that he had not resided long enough in the United States to enter as an American citizen.

LETTER-CARRIERS' SUCCESSFUL DINNER

"Posties" Hold Their Fourth Annual Banquet.

Address by Secretary

Office of Dominion Federation Attends Local Men's Function and Tells of Association's Work

50 Mailmen Present.

The fourth and most successful banquet of the London Letter-carriers was held on Saturday evening at Chivas' Restaurant, Dundas street. Promptly at 9 o'clock between 45 and 50 letter-carriers and sorters sat down to dinner.

After dinner President Ed. Smith introduced the toast list. The program consisted of instrumental songs, speeches, duets and recitations.

Mr. McMordie said he was pleased to be at the letter-carriers' banquet. He always felt at home with them as he had spent 28 years in the service himself. He reviewed the work of the Letter-carriers' Association of London from the year 1894 to the present time. Before 1894 there was no association of letter-carriers. In that year Toronto, Hamilton, London and Winnipeg formed an association, with a total of 138 members. At the present time there are 44 branches throughout Canada, with over 1,000 members. He drew attention to the increase in pay and other benefits the letter-carriers had received by being united, and having an executive to present their grievances to the postal department at Ottawa.
