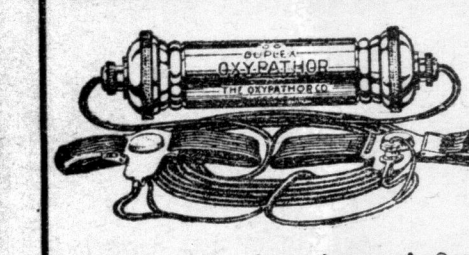

PUREBRED STALLIONS

EXCLUSIVELY AFTER 1918

[Special to The Advertiser.]

Toronto, April 15.—Under legislation introduced by Hon. James S. Duff, minister of agriculture, the improvement of live stock in the Province is to be secured by prohibiting any but pure bred stallions to be used for service after 1918. The stallion enrollment act is to be amended requiring compulsory inspection by Government officers. The various classes of grade stallions are to be eliminated gradually so that only pure bred stock will be available after the year above named.

Another bill to protect pure bred stock imposes a fine on the owner of any bull that runs "at large," which means that the animal must be attended when it is travelling in the highway or away from its home.

CITY MISSED CHANCE DUNDAS CENTRE TO SAYS RAILWAYMAN BUILD PARSONAGE

G. T. Supt. of Eastern Lines Work Will Be Begun Almost Immediately on New Home for Pastor.

NO ELEVATED TRACKS YET \$3,000 IS SUBSCRIBED

Toronto and Montreal Work First—Traffic Promises To Be Heavy in Ontario.

Nine Members Make Donation of One-Third of Required \$9,300 for Building.

Dundas Centre Methodist Church will build a new parsonage. At a meeting of the trustee board of the church last night, held to discuss the matter, it was definitely decided to proceed at once with the work.

That no difficulty will be experienced in raising the necessary funds was evidenced, when, before the meeting had adjourned, the sum of \$3,000 was promised by nine members of the church. The amount which the board decided to raise is \$9,000, and with the subscription of one-third of the required sum already assured it will be an easy matter for the congregation to raise sufficient funds for the erection of the building.

Start at Once. The church has felt the need of a new parsonage for some time, but not until the meeting last night was the matter gone into extensively. The remainder of the amount will probably be subscribed at once.

"Building operations will be started almost immediately," said Rev. A. J. Johnston, pastor of the church, to The Advertiser last night. "With the generous sum already subscribed I am confident that there will be no difficulty in raising the amount."

Canadian Trade Brisk. Comparing trade conditions here with those on the American side of the border, Mr. Bowker stated that business was moving much faster in the Dominion.

"While travelling over the western lines," he said, "I noticed many cars standing idle on sidings. Particularly the freight traffic seems to have suffered. On the other hand, conditions in Ontario are quite the reverse. The company is adding several hundred freight cars of the latest equipment and about 50 of these will be placed on this division. Indications point to a heavy season for the road."

Mr. Bowker left for Montreal on express No. 4 at 3:45 this morning.

LABOR MEN PROTEST TRUSTEES' ACTION

Criticize Awarding Contract to Stratford Firm for Work in London.

CITY TENDERS ARE LOWER

Wrecking of Aberdeen School Goes to Outside Firm—Will See Controllers.

The Trades and Labor Council will send a letter to the board of education protesting against the letting of the contract for the wrecking of Aberdeen School to a Stratford firm. The amount to be paid for the work is about \$1,900, and about \$100 less than the tenders of London firms.

Will See Controllers. A committee will be appointed by the council to approach the board of control, asking that all city contracts be let to London firms whenever possible.

Delegates elected to attend the Labor Educational Association Convention in St. Thomas on May 25, were: Walter Higgins, Joseph Hill, and William Burleigh. The convention is an annual congress of all Ontario labor bodies and trade unions. It will take up the question of selecting labor candidates to municipal councils and school boards, as in Great Britain. Plans for the strengthening and safeguarding of labor interests will be discussed.

May Go to St. Thomas. The next meeting will decide whether a deputation of unions will go to St. Thomas on Labor Day, or whether it will be celebrated here. Delegates were undecided last night what to do in the matter. Reports of a committee appointed last night will be heard at the next meeting on the excursion rates of the railroads, which the council propose running in the summer.

CLERKS EXCLUDED IN WORKMEN'S BILL

Do Not Get Compensation Unless Board Decides.

[Special to The Advertiser.]

Toronto, April 15.—With five committees sitting and the heavy debates of the

session all out of the way, the Legislature is now in the home stretch of the law-making grind for this year. A great many odds and ends of legislation were dealt with this afternoon.

A few more clauses were passed in the workmen's compensation bill, when it was explained by Mr. Lucas that the Government did not intend to include clerks within the provisions of the new law. It would be left to the board to determine what particular hazard should bring a clerk within the schedules as being entitled to compensation.

This point was emphasized by Mr. Studholme in the case of the office staff of a main or work where blasting operations were carried on. While nominally removed from the hazard of the industry, yet they would be subject to danger in case of an explosion. These men, said the minister, would be included in the bill.

WOULD ABOLISH SCHOOL TRUSTEES

North Grey Inspector Finds System Faulty.

Toronto, April 15.—"There are scores growing up in Toronto who receive no education. They are unable to read a newspaper paragraph with any degree of intelligence, and yet their names are on the rolls of the schools."

This statement was made at the meeting of the trustees and school inspectors of the Ontario Board of Educational As-

sociation by H. H. Burgess, inspector of public schools in North Grey, today. Mr. Burgess took his own inspectorate as an example, saying he could not access who were so irregular in attendance at school that they learned nothing. He would substitute for the different school section trustee boards a township board made up of five or six members elected by the whole population of the township, and have the schools supported by equal taxation.
