ROCKEFELLER FUND PLANS NEW TYPE OF DOCTOR

Foundation to Train Physicians as Counselors, Teaching People How to Live and Be Well.

The doctor of the future will be a health counselor, teaching people how to be well rather than simply how to avoid sickness, is the forecast set down by the Rockefeller Foundation in a review of its activities during 1924.

Three quarters of the medical profession to-day consists of the general practitioner, and this group, President Vincent asserts, will be developed in the future into a health counselor.

Activities Are Widespread The Foundation helped to spread international knowledge about medical equipment and teaching methods through surveys by staff members, commissions of scientists, visiting professors and traveling fellows.

In China it maintained a modern medical school and teaching hospital in Peking; aided three other medical schools and seventeen hospitals in that country, and helped to improve the teaching of physics, chemistry and biology in two Chinese and nine foreign institutions in China and in the Government University in Siam.

Aid Louse's Service. It continued to aid the epidemiological intelligence service in the health section of the League of Nations; contributed to the League of Nations international study tours, or interchanges for ninety-nine health officers from twenty countries; provided directly or indirectly fellowships for 864 individuals of thirty-three different nations, and lent staff members and made minor gifts to many governments and institutions for various kinds of counsel and aid.

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135 DIVORCES IN PRESENT SESSION

Ottawa—The Parliament of Canada granted 135 divorces to residents of Ontario and Quebec during the present session of Parliament.

Senator W. E. Willoughby, chairman of the Senate divorce committee, in presenting the report of that committee in the Upper House, made the following comment:

"Of the 136 divorces granted to couples who had been married in Canada 462 were granted by courts of the State of Michigan, 135 were granted in the State of Washington and 128 in California."

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BRITAIN WANTS \$60,000,000 ON ALLIED DEBTS

Does Not Want U. S. to Get Ahead in Collection.

London—Sixty million pounds is the sum Great Britain has mentioned in her note to the Allies concerning her debts as the amount she would gladly receive from them as soon as possible.

All Great Britain asks is that as soon as any of her allies begins to negotiate with the United States they should proceed pari passu to discuss in London their debts to England.

Up to the present she has paid Washington \$80,000,000 and against that she is willing to write off the £20,000,000 which has been received from German reparations.
