The spring, though not very early, was fine, and favorable for the farmers to put their seed into the ground. Of Wheat, but a small quantity was sown, owing to the almost total failure of the crop last year; Barley, Oats, and Buck-wheat, were sown in much larger quantities than usual. Of Potatocs, our farmers planted less than usual, owing to the scarcity of seed last spring; Indian Corn, Turnips, Mangel-Wurzels, were also planted by some. In June, the crops suffered very much from
