Targets will be in view for 20 seconds for each round, and 5 points will be deducted from the score for each shot fired after that interval.—3. When the number of hits on the target exceeds the number of shots allowed in the competition, 5 points will be deducted for every such hit in excess of the number of such shots, unless it be proved that such hits on the target in excess of the number of shots allowed could only be made by competitors in the section firing more than the authorized number of rounds, in which case that section will be disqualified.
