

INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

The activities of a large number of international organizations provide substantial procurement opportunities for Canadian exporters. Most prominent among these institutions are the World Bank and a number of regional development banks which together lend more than US\$40 billion per year for development projects in developing countries. A number of specific agencies of the United Nations also provide opportunities for Canadian suppliers and consultants, who are experienced exporters. These contracts are usually awarded to companies who have international experience.

The most significant of these institutions are listed below.
