NATIONAL PARKS ACT

AMENDMENTS RESPECTING DEFINITION, ACQUISITION, ADMINISTRATION, ETC.

The House resumed from Tuesday, February 24, consideration of the motion of Mr. Chrétien that Bill C-152, to amend the National Parks Act, be read the second time and referred to the Standing Committee on Indian Affairs and Northern Development, and of the proposed amendment thereto of Mr. Lambert (Edmonton West) (page 4030).

Mr. Jack Horner (Crowfoot): Mr. Speaker, on rising to take part in the debate on the principle of this bill I will say at the outset that I am pleased, along with other members who have expressed their opinions on this subject, to see the minister in the House for the first time, as I recall.

Some hon. Members: Hear, hear!

Mr. Horner: I hope that before the bill passes this evening—and perhaps I should like to see it do that-the minister will rise and give us his version of the measure as it affects the people in the national parks at Waterton, Banff and Jasper. I do not think he really meant that they should move out if they did not like conditions there. I urge him to take this opportunity to explain exactly what he did mean and to tell us how the bill before us is likely to help these people.

As I said when the bill was before the House last Tuesday, I am concerned about the principle proposed. We have an amendment which implies that the principle is repugnant. that it should be withdrawn and that the government should reconsider the matter.
