- Adjournment to discuss urgent public matter (S.O. 26)
 - Continuing situation, but deterioration creates urgency in view of impending recess of House, deferring decision to consult House leaders on order of business, 8556; Ms. accepted and set down for debate at 4 p.m. tomorrow, subject to further arrangements by House leaders, 8584
 - Matter before committee, House may discuss in due course, not urgent, not received, 6733-4
 - Matter important and of current interest, but is matter of legislation and not administration, also, clarification of apparent contradictions in ministerial statements can be sought through other means, M. not accepted, 8423
 - Motion would pre-empt supply motion to consider matter which is under continuing discussion and negotiation, and would condemn government policy which is usually done through a non-confidence motion, not received, 7836
 - Not urgent, M. not received, 1414-5, 1540, 1960, 3231, 5825-6, 6628, 7112, 7156, 7711
 - Opportunity to discuss might be arranged by agreement, 1582

 - Wednesday, unanimous consent not given for earlier debate, 2081-3
 - Consultations are now under way which might be relevant to urgency of matter, M. not received, 7884-5
 - Right reserved to propose motion either tomorrow or later, 3673-4, M. accepted, 3747
