"That the said message be communicated "to the House of Commons by one of the "Clerks (or by one of the Masters in "Chancery)." R. 94; M. 587; B. 273.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

- 59. The Speaker calls, "Orders of the Third readings have precedence on the Order Paper, except of those orders to which the Senate may have given priority. Rs. 20, 68; B. 218-219.
- 60. When the Speaker calls "Orders of Clerk-Assistant says," The Assistant reads orders. first order is " (and reads from the Paper), calling the name of the Senator in charge. He should also give the number of each order before reading it; and, when he comes to the last, he says, "The last Order is," &c., &c. B. 218-219.

SPECIAL CASES

61. When the orders have been gone when orders through early, Senators may ask leave to lay disposed of early. papers on the Table, or to present Petitions or to bring in Reports, or to put questions, &c.
