

Dear Bovey:

I have your letter of the 17th instant
relative to Mrs. Mary Duncan Carter.

I am not able to grant your request because
of the restrictions imposed upon us by the provisions of
the Railway Act and the regulations of the Dominion Railway
Board. The work which Mrs. Carter is conducting, while
valuable, is purely educational and in the interests of
the Library School. We cannot very well relate her
activities to anything concerning the welfare of trans-
portation companies and, of course, her case is not one
in which we have much discretion under the statute.
