

possible to diagnose the case, but up to the present very little success has been achieved. This question is most important as without dogs in the winter, travel is almost impossible. I merely mention this in case it may be of use for investigation later, and as a means whereby the close co-operation of the North West Territories Council may be obtained.

6. Up to the present I have not heard from Dr. Tory, but you may rest assured that this question will have my personal sympathetic co-operation.

7; I have suggested your writing to Mr. Rowatt in order that this matter may be considered by the North West Territories Council for the further reason that the North West Territories Branch of the Interior also have their own employees in the far north, including medical doctors who no doubt would be of additional assistance.

8. If you agree with my suggestion it would prevent delay and would have the advantage of wider scope, and Professor Cameron's detailed instructions could be sent later to the North West Territories Council for transmission to the Police and the officials of the North West Territories, once a plan of operations has been decided upon.
