
ST. PAUL'S ANGLICAN CHURCH A MARVEL OF ARCHITECTURE

New Building To Be Opened Next Sunday, Cost \$350,000, and Has an Ordinary Seating Capacity of 2500 - Beautiful Features in the Design Will Set a Higher Standard of Achievement in Ecclesiastical Field.

The new St. Paul's Anglican Church, just completed on East Bloor street, Toronto, at an estimated cost of about \$350,000 presents in its design features of an outstanding interest to the technical man and in its construction, points of general interest to the layman.

With a view to conveying a general impression of this interesting work and before entering into a detailed description thereof, it may be observed that the building will provide greater seating accommodation than any other church in Canada with the exception of the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Montreal. As a local comparison, the seating accommodation of St. James' Cathedral is from 1000 to 1200, while that of the new St. Paul's church will be about 2500 - and the capacity was taxed to the utmost a great many more could be accommodated.

The front facade is well designed and monumental in appearance. It varies in detail and form in several different stages in its design. The three large entrance doors well impressed with splendidly designed arch mouldings and cut stone tracery extend across the front main and side wing gables, all of which stand out well in relief. Above this arcade are three large decorated windows - sometimes called "three-story gables" - windows constituting an attractive feature. These also are embellished with columns and archivolts mouldings, and variegated stone tracery. tion, the intention being that nothing should detract from the substantial appearance and solidity of a well designed Gothic structure. The interior of the church has been designed after the cathedral style. The general ground plan of the church is cruciform, with nave, aisles, transepts, side aisles which carry the nave, choir with ambulatory or passage running all around it and vestry. The exterior dimensions are: length 220 feet; width 140 feet; height 97 feet. The interior are: length of nave, 152 feet; width of nave and aisles, 76 feet; width of nave, aisles and side aisles, 106 feet; width of transepts, 130 feet; height to apex of spire, 81 feet. ally all parts of the church. The three large traceried windows in the gable above the communion table rise over three exquisitely beautiful lancet-arched windows, behind which in the ambulatory are three small lancet windows. The effect of the light from these against the darker wall is to enhance the appearance of depth in the choir. The choir itself is not too deep to interfere with its practical purpose of providing adequate accommodation for the singers to lead the service of congregational praise.

Immediately inside the front entrance is a wide narthex, or vestibule, with groined roof. This forms the base of the gallery extending across the end of the building. The front of this gallery is formed by a beautiful cut stone balustrade, with varied tracery in the arches. Perhaps no single feature of the building, except possibly the great rose windows, is more beautiful or effective than this. From this gallery the finest view of the whole building can be obtained. Here, too, can be perceived the difference between the complete unity of a classical building, the whole of which strikes the eye at once, and the organic unity of a Gothic edifice, every part of which suggests other portions which lie beyond the view.

The roof is of open timber work, with Gothic tracery of dark color. The electric lighting is hidden in the roof. The architect has deliberately chosen this style of roofing in preference to a plaster ceiling, to imitate stone. Here as in every detail he has chosen reality, and made things to look like what they are. Each principal or massive feature is supported by a massive pier. There is an air of weight over the glorious light spaces below. The pews and choir stalls are of dark oak, and add the needed touch of warmth to the gray interior and the soft gray finish of the walls. The pulpit is of carved oak, hexagonal in shape, enriched with cusped panels and figures.

Communion Table. The communion table is of oak, paneled and with elaborate tracery, finished on all four sides. It stands on a marble tiled platform, so that one may walk around it. The table is in harmony with the general architectural character of the building. They are of iron with dull finish, and hang by chains from the hammerhead of the roof on each side of the nave. The floors throughout are constructed of concrete, fireproof, and serve also to emphasize the solidity of the structure. The lines of the whole building are grand, yet simple. The proportions are admirable. There is nothing gaudy or tawdry or over-ornate; everything is solid, simple, graceful. The very building with its soaring roof, preaching a lesson of reverence and inspiration, and brings an air of worship about all who enter its portals. While only the main features of design and construction have been touched upon in the present article, the particulars given will suffice to show that this building will set another and a higher standard of achievement in the ecclesiastical field. No more certain evidence of the progress and prosperity of a community can be adduced than the stability and elaboration of its temples.
