TO CALL TENDERS FOR SHIP CANAL

Engineer Prepares Specifications for New Port Between Thorold and Allanburg.

ST. CATHARINES, March 9.—The return of Chief Engineer Walker of the Welland Ship Canal from Ottawa yesterday is being followed by the active preparations of the specifications for a new part of section 4 of the big work to be known as section 4A, between Thorold and Allanburg. On this section there will be one supply well and two culverts across the dumping ground procured by the government from the waterworks commission of the City of St. Catharines.

One hundred men are now engaged on No. 2 section, 450 on No. 2, and 150 Port Well. Dredging in the new harbor will be resumed on April 1. The building of the government railway along the entire route of the work is proceeding in sections. This will be completed before warm weather arrives.
