The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion lands Agency or sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at sity agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.
Duties.-Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land up each on three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homesteader on a farm of a least 50 acres kniet, owner, and districts a homesteader.
In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter sector alongside his homestead. Price S.00 per acre.




