TORONTO OFFICERS IN CASUALTIES

Lieut. A. D. Elder, Signaling Officer, Dies of Wounds.

Rev. James W. and Mrs. Wilkinson, 113 Grace street, have received word that their son, Bombardier Harold Wilkinson, was killed in action on Nov. 10.

Word has reached Toronto that Lieut. John A. D. Elder, signaling officer, 88th Battalion, died of wounds on Oct. 30.
