## COP SOLD SAFETY WHISTLES TO THE GUILTY CHINESE

Said Warning Would Bring Speedy Help in Time of Trouble - Is Fired.

At the meeting of the police commissioners yesterday, the resignation of P. C. John A. Hyland was requested. He joined the force in 1880. The charge against him was trafficking in whistles with Chinamen, who live in the city. It is claimed he was selling ten cent lead whistles to the "Chinks", and giving them to understand that blowing on the whistle would bring policemen to their aid on the "double" or "triple" in the language of Wun Lung. "Blowee like hellee, peeceee come like hellee."

The resignation of P. C. Longstreet was accepted, and P. C. Boyd convicted of theft from a comrade, was dismissed.

The request of the R. & O. Navigation Company to have one of their men made a special constable was refused. More police protection will be given the factory district in the vicinity of the subway as soon as men are available, which will not be for two months.

## CRAPSEY, JUDGES DECLARE, SHOULD BE SUSPENDED

Anglican Clergyman Guilty of Teaching Doctrines Not in Conformity With Creed of Church.

Rochester, N.Y., May 15.—Rev. Algeron S. Crapsey was found guilty of heresy by the ecclesiastical court which tried him at Batavia recently. Four of the judges declared him guilty as specified in the charges under which he was tried. The fifth, Dr. Dunham, agrees with his colleagues in the main, but dissents from their judgment so far as to state that his belief is that Crapsey's errors resulted in presumption to deny what God has been pleased to reveal rather than to deny its truth.

The judges say sentence should be passed as follows:

"That the respondent should be suspended from exercising the functions of the church until such time as he shall satisfy the ecclesiastical authorities of the diocese that his belief and teaching conform to the doctrine of the Apostles Creed and the Nicene Creed. This church hath received the same. However, we express the earnest hope and desire that the respondent may see his way clear during the thirty days, must intervene before sentence can be pronounced to the full satisfaction of the ecclesiastical authorities of such content on his part."

Ottawa, May 15.—Judge McTavish expects that the insurance commission will complete its work in about six weeks. The commission will resume in Toronto next Monday and should finish in two weeks there. There will be a sitting for a few days in Montreal, and the work will be completed in Ottawa after which the report will be compiled at once.

## BARQUE SINKS WITH CREW.

Bordeaux, France, May 15.—The Russian steamer Leo collided to-day in the estuary of the Gironde, near Pauillac, 27 miles from here, with the Italian barque Teresa Mignano, Capt. Quarto. The barque sank and eight of her crew and two pilots were drowned.

An admirable program, consisting of vocal and instrumental music and recitations, was given, after which J. H. Bennett acted as auctioneer. A most enjoyable evening was spent by the members.

A number of C. P. R. officials and agents left in a special sleeping car on No. 6 for Montreal and Quebec, as long-distance circuits. Another special feature was the electric lighting of the train, which was done by the operation of a steam turbine engine and fuel tank situated in the baggage car and fed by steam from the locomotive.

San Francisco, May 15.—Certain insurance companies doing business in San Francisco are charging double the rates on local business that were assessed before the recent fire.


