The Government report, issued yesterday, is undoubtedly very bullish, but the speculative crowd looked for the usual result following these reports and started in selling heavily, giving us a decline of \( \frac{1}{2} \) for one firm opening. On the break there was no indication of what was to follow, but as we have expected, the effect of the recent heavy purchases of cash, wheat and option for foreign account began to be fully demonstrated when shorts started to cover, and a general buying fever struck the market carrying prices nearly 2c up from lowes point. Outside trade has increased some what, and we look for more activity and better-prices. The enquiry for cash wheat was excellent, although the business reported was probably not as large as expected. New York reports 40 loads taken and there were 200,000 bush winter wheat taken here. Receipts in the Northwest were again large, 1143 cars, but shipment from there show a good demand to exist.
