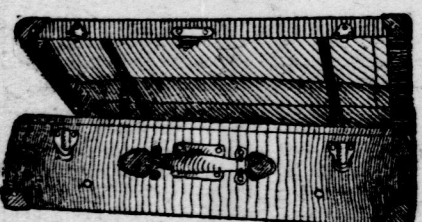

ANNUAL HARVEST HOME SERVICES

Held by the Salvation Army

Proved Very Successful—

Neat Sums Raised.

The annual harvest home services of the Salvation Army were brought to a close last night by one of the most successful concerts ever given in the barracks. The services lasted three days, and were well attended, especially the one on Sunday, when the hall was filled to overflowing.

At last night's concert, excellent addresses were given by Adjutant Hobbins and Staff-Capt. McMillan. At the close of the programme an auction sale was held, at which the offerings were disposed of. The Army have been attempting to raise \$300, and as a result of their efforts have succeeded in raising considerably more than that amount.

A carload of peaches from Michigan arrived in the city yesterday afternoon, and found a ready sale on the market today. The consignment comprised about 300 bushels, and sold from \$3 to \$3 50 per bushel. The local grocers were by far the largest buyers, and some of them propose to repack the fruit and sell it in twelve-quart baskets.

CRUELTY TO PIGS

ON THE MARKET

"There is a practice that should be stopped," declared a buyer on the market this morning, pointing to a wagon load of swine which a farmer was industriously poking with an iron prong in an endeavor to make them go down an incline to the market scales.

"Those pigs," continued the buyer, were stuffed so full of food before they were brought here to be weighed that they are stupid and barely able to move. Cattle, when they are fed too much, get into the same condition. The man who buys that load that you see there is liable to lose not a few on the trip to the packing house, especially if the trip be a rough one."

When questioned, an employee of the market stated that the law in reference to weighing swine called for the use of no food on the morning of the weighing.

One reason given for the laxity in applying the law on the London market is said to be that the competition between the buyers is so keen now-a-days that they are willing to put up with almost anything to keep their factories supplied.

The supply now being brought in is much lower than in former years, although the prices of wholesale pork has not advanced in proportion.

THE BANK OF B. N. A.

Half-Yearly Report Shows This Excellent Institution To Be Still Forging Ahead.

The half-yearly report of the Bank of British North America has been issued, and shows that this well-known bank is making rapid strides. The profits of the half-year, including \$95,439.86 brought forward from last account, amount to \$331,607.45, out of which the directors have declared an interim dividend of 30s per share on October 4 next, being at the rate of 6 per cent per annum, leaving a balance of \$176,173.45 to be carried forward.

The sum of \$29,492 has been transferred from the profits of the half-year to the credit of the bank's investment in Consols, which now stand at \$3.

The directors also appropriated from the profit and loss account for the

benefit of the staff the following sums: To the officers' widows and orphan fund, \$2,500 to the officers' pension fund, \$6,934.

The Bank of North America has opened up three branches during the past half-year—one in Toronto, one in Cainsville, Ont., and one in this city, at the corner of the Hamilton road and Egerton street. This last makes three branches in London—one on Richmond street, the Market branch, and the one mentioned above. The growth of the bank's business in the city has been little short of phenomenal, and the institution is at present going ahead rapidly.
