A formal welcome on behalf of the city was extended by Crontroller Hocken.

W. Wilson stated that there are be 26,000 and 27,000 independent iones in operation in Canada. In Alberta and Manitoba, where the Bell equipment was purchased by the government, over a year ago, the mileage and number of phones in use has increased very rapidly.

J. B. Ware, general secretary of the International Independent Telephone Association, stated that in 1895 there were only 245,000 telephones in the United States, but as a result of cometition there are now more than six

"As a result of competition," he remarked, "the independent companies have installed new plants and forced the other companies to improve theirs."

Competition Would Help.

Toronto, he claimed, is not as well equipped in the matter of telephones as it would be if competition existed. He condemned those independent companies who sold out to the Belli Company. Some who should have re-mained loyal had become traitors, he said, and sold out because there was money in it for them. It was an illegal and an immoral transaction.


